#### **UPDATES ON OUR PAST PROJECTS**

Thank you for your contribution to our research in the past. This research is continuing to make an impact on brain injury rehabilitation internationally.

Some highlights from 2020 include:

- The <u>TBIconneCT</u> and <u>TBI Express</u> communication partner training programs are being accessed by speech pathologists worldwide. The TBIconneCT program was a helpful resources for speech pathologists working via telehealth during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Our research findings were published in peer-reviewed journals, including the <u>American Journal of Speech-Language Pathology</u>, <u>Aphasiology</u>, <u>Brain Impairment</u>, <u>Brain Injury</u>, <u>International Journal of Language and Communication Disorders</u>, <u>Journal of Head Trauma Rehabilitation</u>. <u>Journal of Speech Language and Hearing Research</u>, <u>Journal of Telemedicine and Telecare</u>, and <u>Topics in Language Disorders</u>.
