Research Update



We interviewed and surveyed lots of people.



We talked to:

- people with communication support needs

They told us about problems they have in health services.



Some problems include:




 People with disability are treated differently



 Health care workers do not ask if a person has communication support needs



 Noise, lights, and space around the room make it hard to communicate



 Important information is not communicated well



 Health care workers do not have enough training about disability





We are asking people which problems are most important.



Then we will talk about how to fix the problem.



Learning about Co-design



This is Jade and Angela.

They are speech pathology students from The University of Sydney.



Jade and Angela practised using **co-design** with the project team.

Co-design is when we work with different people to make decisions together.



They talked about making **placements** better for students in the project.

A **placement** is when students go to a workplace to learn.





Jade, Angela, and the team talked about problems that happen on placements.



The team decided the most important problem is:

Students and **supervisors** have trouble getting to know each other when they are in different places.

A **supervisor** is someone that helps students learn.



The team talked about how to solve the problem.





They decided to make a welcome video.

This will help students feel comfortable when they start placement.



Jade and Angela understand **co-design** now.

They know it is important for all voices to be heard.



Project Impact: Resources and Training



The Council for Intellectual Disability made a training pack for healthcare workers.

It is called Just Include Me.



It will help healthcare workers communicate better with people who have communication support needs.
